

WHOLE COMMUNITY FAITH SHARING Week of August 25 - Luke 13:22-30

Faith Reflection: In today's Gospel, an onlooker asks, "Lord, will only a few be saved?" Jesus' response, the short parable about the narrow gate, seems restrictive. Yet read in the context of the rest of the Gospel, the message is not about exclusivity, but rather about hard work and due diligence... virtues that do not come easy to us. Safeguard our Children

How is compliance with child prevention efforts verified?

While background checks and fingerprinting of all those who work with children in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles are important, they are used in conjunction with abuse awareness and prevention training programs to help ensure that we create the safest possible parish and school environments for our children. An archdiocesan background-tracking information system, Volunteer and Personnel Information Network (VPIN), tracks assignment histories and compliance by employees and volunteers of fingerprinting, background checks and mandatory VIRTUS sexual abuse prevention training. VPIN allows parishes and schools to adapt features of the system to fit their local needs and it assists the archdiocese to complete its audit reports.

PARTNERSHIP IN SERVICE AWARD

Congratulations to Sister Kathleen Patrice, C.S.J. who received a Partnership in Service Award from Catholic Charities in Santa Barbara earlier this summer. The award recognizes outstanding parishioners who give themselves in service at the parish. Sister Kathleen Patrice serves as the Religious Education Director for our Parish and oversees the Confirmation and Youth Ministry Programs. In her free time, she serves in many other ways: with caring for the homeless; with organizing the Christmas Giving Tree and Santa's Workshop Program, which helps families in need at Christmas, in the housing projects in Carpinteria, families served by Catholic Charities in Santa Barbara and families served by St. Vincent's; is in charge of the Corazon project to build a home for a poor family in Mexico in April; organizes El Campo del Sol in August to help children in need prepare for the opening of school; works with Father Steve in our parish sharing in M-4 movement in the four Churches in Santa Barbara. Well, done Sister. Our Parish is blessed by your presence and ministry.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK "Fr. Steve"

"I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory" - these words from the First Reading set the theme for today's Mass: that God calls all people to salvation. In the Gospel, Jesus says that "people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the Kingdom of God." We will have lots of surprises because "some are last who will be first and some are first who will be last." We must respond to God's call not only by words but by lives of faith and love so we can enter the "narrow" gate - by ourselves its not possible, only with God's grace. Our wholehearted response to God's call and grace is important and necessary.

- * Each summer each parish welcomes a missionary speaker to Sunday Mass to ask for prayers and financial support as part of the Missionary Cooperative Plan. This year Deacon Michael Neba, a seminarian from the Archdiocese of Bamenda, Cameroon, West Central Africa, will speak at all Masses this Sunday, August 25, making an appeal for the support of the Church in his Archdiocese. We are a missionary Church, given a world wide mission by our Savior, Jesus Christ. Your prayers and financial support will be very much appreciated.
- * Very many thanks to all who are responding to the Adopt A Student Appeal for donations or pledges to provide scholarship tuition help for students at Our Lady of Mount Carmel School. Your gift could cover the weekly cost of \$140, the monthly cost of \$540 or the full \$5,400 to educate a child for the entire year. Your gift is an investment in the future and it is priceless to the child who receives it.

- * Parish Summer Repairs: Two major projects so far this summer:
- I. Replacing of the sewer line serving the Church, the School and the Rectory. The final cost was \$12237, much more than the original estimate of \$8,000 because of the need to install a back water valve and a pocket of large rocks and small boulders that required the digging of a third 6 foot deep hole.
- 2. Replacing wooden beams in the walkway between the Sacristy and the Rest Rooms because of severe wood rot. The cost of the wood materials so far has been \$4,000. Two roof supporting beams in the same area were also found to have severe wood rot from the rains and will require replacement also.
