THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD **JANUARY 11, 2015**

The Christmas season ends today with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus. After many years of silent life in Nazareth, Jesus now begins his public ministry by coming to John the Baptist at the river Jordan. John is saying: "I have baptized with water; he will baptize with the Holy Spirit"(Mark 1:7ff). Jesus shows he is one with us in his humanity as he joins sinners in the waters of repentance and conversion. But Jesus is more than human. He is divine. As he is baptized by John, the Spirit descends upon Jesus and the voice of God is heard coming from the heavens: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Now Jesus begins his ministry of preaching, going about "doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil" (as we hear in our Second Reading from the Acts of the Apostles 10:34ff).

Today is a good day to recall our own Baptism in Christ, Like Christ we too are anointed with the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and called to bring light and hope and the Good News of God's love to our troubled world.

• This Sunday, the Church Baptistry will be open at Mass times so you can visit this beautiful part of our Church on the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus, and to remind you of your own Baptism.

• On Monday we begin Ordinary Time in the Church year. Ordinary Time refers to the thirty four weeks of the Church year that are not part of the Advent-Christmas or Lent-Easter seasons. All time is sacred to God and every Sunday is of great importance as the day of the Lord's resurrection and the day of the completion of creation. Let every Sunday be a day of worship together at Eucharist and a day of play and rest in God's love.







AN ANCIENT BAPTISTERY

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In the 1560s, the Council of Trent attempted to standardize the widely variant customs for the pastoral care of the sick and dying. We had inherited a practice called "extreme unction," from the Latin words meaning anointing at the point of death. The deeper tradition, however, is about the prayer of faith that will heal and restore the sick person, and is straight from the Letter of James. The Fathers went back to the beginning, and while not discarding the "extreme unction" name, made a plea for the proper use of this sacrament. As soon as a person is in danger of death from sickness or old age, they reasoned, the time for the sacrament had already arrived.

As a result of this desire, the next ritual text for anointing contained an innovation: a rite for visiting the sick that included readings from scripture, psalms, and prayers. Old customs fade slowly, however, and the quality of pastoral care languished for centuries while people delayed the celebration of a consoling and effective sacrament, sometimes missing the opportunity completely. A priest ministering to a dying and unconscious patient alone in a room has never been the desire of the Church. Our tradition is far too rich for this sacrament to be celebrated in such a diminished and ungenerous manner. Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
