FROM THE PASTORS DESK O J. S. Paluch Co., Inc. Fr. Steve

In today's Gospel we see the disciples terrified by the storm on the lake and the power of Jesus in quieting the wind and the waves (Mark 4:35~ 41). They ask: "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?" Our First Reading (from Job 38:1, 8 ~11) and Responsorial Psalm (107:23ff) lead us to the answer; God is the one who exerts power over storm and sea. Jesus is our Lord and God and is with us in the storms of life which come to us through illness or trouble at work or in our family or problems in the world. Jesus is with us saying: "Why are you terrified? Do you not have faith?" The presence of Jesus to us is loving, supporting, calming, renewing. All this is expressed well in the hymn: "Precious Lord": "Precious Lord, take my hand, let me stand. I am tired, I am weak, I am worn. Through the storm, through the night, Lead me on to the Light. Take my hand, Precious Lord. Lead me home."

- On this Father's Day we wish all our fathers "A Happy Father's Day." The "Book of Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers" has this prayer for Father's Day: "God our Father, in your wisdom and love you made all things. Bless our father. Let the example of his faith and love shine forth. Grant that we, his family, may honor him always with a spirit of profound respect. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen"
- A Novena of Masses for Father's Day begins this Sunday and will continue for the next nine days. Cards and envelopes will be found at the doors of the Church.


