# FROM THE PASTORS DESK Fr. Steve

The Readings for Sunday Eucharist: In our First Reading from Wisdom 1:13ff we hear: "God did not make death." We hear that God is the giver of life. He sustains life. He desires that we have fullness of life in Christ Iesus. Even though sickness and death may claim us, yet now and always we belong to the Lord. "Do not be afraid; just have faith" are the words of Jesus as he prepares to raise the daughter of Jairus to life in today's Gospel (Mark 5:21ff). These words of Jesus are for us today as we face sickness and death. We also hear Jesus saying today: "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured" - these are his words to the woman who has been sick for twelve years. In life and in death, in sickness and health, what we need are faith in Jesus our Savior and trust in God who gives us life now and at the moment of our death. We can also make a world of difference to someone who is suffering or mourning through our love, our presence, our sympathy, our faith in Iesus.

- We celebrate the great blessing of freedom in our land as we celebrate Independence Day, July 4th, on Saturday. We invite you to come and celebrate our nation's independence at Holy Eucharist at 7:45 AM. On Saturday evening, we will have the Sunday Vigil Mass at 4:30pm. A Happy Fourth of July to all!!
- We welcome to our parish this weekend Father Liam O'Connell, S.J., the cousin of Father Maurice O'Mahony, our Pastor Emeritus. Father Liam has come to serve at Mount Carmel each summer for the last seventeen years. He will be with us until July 27th.
- As Father Liam arrives, Father Steve, our Pastor, leaves on his annual vacation. He will return to Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 25th.
- Work begins soon on some major renovation projects this summer:
- 1. Installing a new school roof on the west wing of our parish school: from classroom 7 to the school office. This work will begin on July 6th. Cost: \$38,550.
- 2. We need to replace the main water line from Hot Springs Road to the Church and Rectory. This pipe is as old as the Church (79 years). Last July a major leak happened and the repair cost was

- \$1,030, plus a water penalty of \$600 for using too much water. Work will begin on June 29th, replacing the water line and the gas line and also putting in a water line that one day would service a sprinkler system in the Church. When the work begins, the walkway between the Church and the school will be closed for some weeks for trench digging, etc. Estimated cost: \$34,000.
- 3. Asphalt repair will take place early in August on sections of the school playground. Cost: \$10,000.

These three projects must take place during the summer while school is closed. We invite donations from generous parishioners and friends for any of these repairs/renovations. Any gifts or donations would be helpful in meeting the many needs for maintaining and renovating our Church and school buildings

# WHOLE COMMUNITY FAITH SHARING Week of June 28th—Mark 5:21-24, 35-43

Reflection: In today's Gospel, Jairus comes to Jesus with his heart breaking and says "My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her." Touch is used many times in today's Gos~ pel. When the woman touched Jesus' cloak, she was healed. It was through touch that the life of Jesus was communicated to the woman and healed her. Iesus also took the dead child by the hand, that is he touched her, as she was restored to life. Touching is one of our basic human senses. We touch others and others touch us in many different ways. We touch others physically by putting our arms around their shoulders or hugging them. Others touch us by the look in their eyes, by the words that they speak, by the acts of charity that they do for us. By our touch we can communicate love and affection, we can communicate unity.

Question: Do I always remember that no prayer is unanswered and that prayer works in God's time? Faith Response: This week I will pray for those in need of healing and meditate on Jesus' words "Do not be afraid; only have faith."





# WE URGE A NO VOTE ON SB 128

As a Church we believe in the Gospel of Life ~ life as a precious gift of God from the moment of conception to natural death. We oppose SB 128 which is now passing through the State Assembly in Sacramento and would legalize assisted suicide in California. We oppose SB 128 because:

a. It sends the wrong message - legalizing suicide for the terminally ill, while discouraging it for the rest of the population, teaches that the lives of the ill and disabled do not matter to our society;

b. It will worsen patient care: patients in other states, like Barbara Wagner in Oregon, are being denied treatment prescribed by their doctors and instead offered drugs for assisted suicide;

c. It will increase non-terminal suicide rates: suicide rates skyrocket when assisted suicide is legalized. Oregon's suicide rate for non-terminal people increased 49% after assisted suicide became legal. You are encouraged to use www.AHardPill.org to contact your Assembly members and urge a NO vote on SB128.

# Prayer to Stop Assisted Suicide

O God, source of all life and hope, look kindly on our brothers and sisters facing the end of their lives, fill them with the hope of your mercy and give them peace and comfort.

We pray for our California Legislators who are considering legalizing assisted suicide, inspire them to protect the lives of the elderly, the infirm and the disabled.

Renew our commitment to building a community where every human life is welcomed and wanted, valued and defended - from conception to natural death.
