The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) June 7, 2015

The cup of salvation I will take up, and I will call upon the name of the LORD.

~ Psalm 116:13

Fr. Steve

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ ("Corpus Christi"). This feast began in 1261 as a way of showing great reverence and love for Christ present in a special way in the Holy Eucharist. In today's Gospel Reading (Mark 14:12ff) we hear how Jesus at the Last Supper gave us himself in the Holy Eucharist: "Take it; this is my body...This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many." The word "covenant" is found in all three Readings today. "Covenant: means "agreement" or "promise" that God makes with us in the Blood of Christ: we are his people, he is our God. In the Eucharist we celebrate this Holy Communion - oneness with God and with each other in Christ. Our "Amen" at Holy Communion expresses our response: "Yes, I believe, this is Jesus who comes to me now in a Holy Communion with God and all others who share this Eucharist." Nourished and strengthened by Christ in Holy Communion, and by his Real Presence with us in the Eucharist in the Tabernacle, we can go and be the presence of Christ in the world, reaching out in compassion to a11.

Thousands of faithful from throughout the Archdiocese cele-brate the eight newly ordained priest – double the number from 2014

Archbishop José H. Gomez ordained eight new priests last Sunday, May 31st, for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in downtown Los Angeles.

The men who entered the priesthood are Fr. Gabriel Kang, Fr. Jonathon Meyer, Fr. Juan Cano, Fr. Luis Estrada, Fr. Marinello Saguin, Fr. Parker Sandoval, Fr. Raymont Medina and Fr. Simeon Song.

"Every new priest is a living image of Jesus Christ. And every ordination is a sign of his final promise — that he will be with us until the end of the age," said Archbishop Gomez during the homily. Archbishop Gomez called the new priests to "be men of mercy and give of themselves to others with the loving heart of a servant."

All of the new priests completed their theological formation at St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, including service as transitional deacons and year-long internships at Archdiocesan parishes.

"The Holy Spirit is still calling men to give of themselves completely in the service of Christ and his church as priests. In a world of instant self-gratification many Catholic men are still choosing a life of self-sacrifice and service of others," said Fr. Samuel Ward, Associate Director of Vocations at the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. "The Catholic church has great hope for our new priests and the priesthood going forward."

Upon conclusion of Mass the new priests gave their first public blessings on the Cathedral Plaza surrounded by family, friends, members of their parish communities, their pastors and other priest mentors.

(According to a report by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the total number of potential ordinands in the U.S. for the class of 2015 is 595, which is up from 477 in 2014 and 497 in 2013.)


