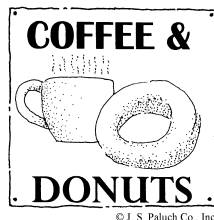
Faith Question: How can I have a greater sense of compassion to help recognize those in need this week?

2013 TOGETHER IN MISSION

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we return to using the green vestments of Ordinary Time on Sundays. Changing colors give a sense of the progress of faith through the seasons of life. For centuries, the number of colors and the reasons underlying them were left to local custom. Over time, the Church settled on six colors to express the character of a day or season: white, red, green, violet, black, and rose. Black is seldom seen these days, replaced by white or violet. Rose, really a dusty pink shade, appears at most twice a year. What does the color green suggest to you? Green is new growth, olives, evergreens, glistening emeralds, ripening pears, and fields at high summer. It suggests renewal, healing, fertility, peace, and harmony. Did you know that drivers of green cars are the least likely to be stopped for speeding? Is it because of their own feelings of harmony and well being, or because law enforcement officers are filled with serenity when they see a green car whiz by? Take out a paint chart today and marvel at the many hues and names of green.

The Church figured it out centuries ago: color really does matter.

God is life-giving and re-creating life in each and all of us in different ways and at different times in our lives. God revives and resuscitates a young child in the First Reading today as the prophet Elijah cries out to God with great pleading and prayer: "O Lord, my God, let the life breath return to the body of this child." The compassion of Elijah for the widow and her son is seen even more in the great compassion of Jesus for the widow of Nain in today's Gospel. "Do not weep", Jesus says to the widow. He steps forward, touches the coffin and raises the young man to life and restores him to his widowed mother.

The life-giving power of God in Jesus is seen also in the story of Paul in the Second Reading as God calls him from his very zealous living of the Jewish way of life to a new awareness of God's presence, love and salvation in Jesus his Son. God continues to show his divine care, love and healing for each person each day. Pablo Casals, the great musician once said: "Each day I am reborn, each day I must begin anew." For all who believe in Jesus as Savior and Son of God, each day is a new beginning and life renewing adventure with God.

* After the fifty day celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter and other Feasts of the Lord, we return to the period of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time refers to the thirty four weeks of the Church year that are not part of the Advent-Christmas or Lent-Easter seasons. All time is sacred to God and every Sunday is of great importance as the day of the Lord's resurrection and the day of the completion of creation. Let every Sunday be a day of worship together at Eucharist and a day of play and rest in God's love.
