

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

FR. STEVE

Being able to see is one of God's most precious gifts to us. How wonderful it is to see loved ones, and to see the beauty of God's creation in the mountains, the ocean, trees and flowers and in each person we meet. Our First Reading tells us how important it is to see as God sees because "man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart." In the Gospel today Jesus, "the light of the world", heals the man who is blind from birth. The man comes to see the light in Jesus and ends up saying: "I do believe, Lord" and worships Jesus as Lord. St. Paul tells us in the Second Reading that through Baptism we have received the light of Christ and must live "as children of the light." Each day we are called to turn from darkness and walk in the light of Christ. Each morning we can make our own the closing words of St. Paul today: "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead and Christ will give you light."


