OUR PARISH FINANCES

Update on Major Renovation Projects this summer:

1. Work continues on renovating the men's rest room in the Parish Hall because of a methane gas leak there. In removing the

sewer line it was found in poor condition so we decided to remove the sewer line in the women's rest room (which was also buried under concrete). This means that both rest rooms in the Parish Hall are closed until the renovation work is completed and then both rest rooms will be wheelchair accessible. In the meanwhile the Church rest rooms will be available for use whenever there are activities in the Parish Hall. Cost estimate: \$25,000.

- 2. We are waiting for the new awning installation at the Parish Hall and then the replacement of the awnings at the house and parking area of the home of the Pastor Emeritus. Cost estimate: \$12,670.
- 3. Work is completed on the renovation of the School offices, administrative and faculty area of the School; the painting of the outside of the school buildings; some heating and air conditioning work in the Rectory; and the treatment of a rust problem on the bell structure on the roof of the Church.

We are very grateful to four parish families who have made generous donations to fund these projects. So far we have received \$19,711 from four parish families. We are also very grateful to a parish family who have donated new beautiful tables and chairs for the renovated School faculty room.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK Fr. Steve

Today is Respect Life Sunday, a day when the U.S. Bishops invite us to focus on God's gift of life from conception to natural death. Our First Reading and Gospel today speak of God's care and concern for his people, his "vineyard". God nurtures his precious vineyard, his people, giving us life and love and caring, and doing everything possible to make us flourish. How do we respond? Do we produce "wild grapes", useless fruit (as the vineyard in the First Reading from Isaiah 5:1-7)? Do we reject God's messengers of life (as the tenants in the Gospel story, Matthew 21:33~43)? They beat, kill and stone the servants of the landowner. "They will respect my son", the landowner says. Instead they seize and kill him. Certainly no respect for life here! Today we are called to open our eyes to God's gift of life to us each day and God's nurturing and caring for all people. The Gos~ pel of life calls us to a commitment to respect life at all times and to work for peace and an end to war and violence.

- The theme for this year's Respect Life Sunday is: "Each of us is a masterpiece of God's Creation." This is Pope Francis' Day of Life Greeting: "Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect."
