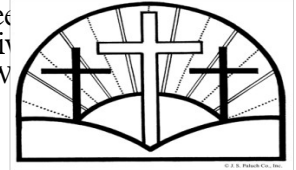

Gospel - John 20:1-9

Reflection: I reflect on Easter Sunday as the day my Mother dressed me up, gloves, hat and all, we attended Mass and arrived home to hidden eggs all over the yard. She tried to get us to eat the Easter ham and eggs that she had prepared, but we usually ate nothing but chocolate bunnies and jelly beans! As I reflect on Easter today, it's a much different scene. I pray the entire week that I am someday worthy to enter Heaven, that my soul will be saved and that I would appreciate that Jesus died to save me from my worldly sins.

Reflective Question: What does Easter mean to me?

Faith Response: As we end the holiest week in our year, I will pray each day, not only for myself but for mankind, to harken back to a gentler time, a more reverent time, a time for a couple chocolate bunnies and a time to celebrate His resurrection.

TODAY'S READINGS

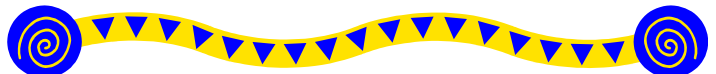
First Reading — Peter is an eyewitness: The Lord is risen (Acts 10:34a, 37-43).

Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel

There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary’s own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel’s call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way.
