Yesterday was the memorial for our new Saint, Padre Junipero Serra. This 1800 century saint helped bring the Christian religion to California by founding 9 of the 21 missions. In 2017 he was canonized by Pope Francis, yet, people have wanted to tear down his statue in Ventura during this time of civil unrest that our country is experiencing. Bigotry and racism are evils that plague our country, but anger toward St. Junipero is misplaced since he was working very hard to show the dignity and sanctity of the native peoples of California. This weekend is the great holiday of the 4th of July, where we celebrate the statement that "all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights." This concept is something that Padre Serra identified with, for unlike many from the colonial system, he did not see native peoples as "barbarians" and "savages," but as people loved by God. Archbishop Gomez has written a letter in response to the misinterpretation of history regarding St. Junipero Serra. I have attached it here for your reading and will be putting it up on our website.
